Fig. 2 CPS-Related Citation Frequency by County

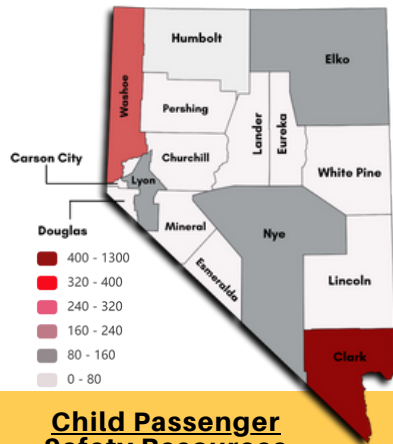
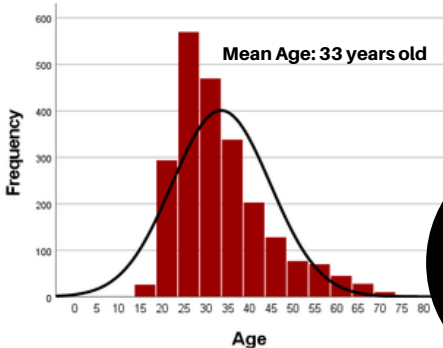


Fig. 1 CPS-Related Violator Age

Child Passenger Safety Resources

- Appointments are available - Check [nhtsa.gov](https://www.nhtsa.gov) for where you can schedule a car seat check appointment near you.
- Buy the right car seat - There is an appropriate car seat for every stage in your child's life. Nevada law requires booster seats until the child is age 6 and 57" tall.
- Correct car seat use every single time can save your baby's life. Child safety seats can reduce the risk of death by 71%. (SafeKids Worldwide)
